

The New York State Pistol Permit Class – also known as the “Concealed Carry Permit Class” or the “Firearms Safety Course”, is required to be completed before applying for the Erie, Niagara, Orleans & Genesee County NYS Pistol Permit process.

The NYS Pistol Permit class (Concealed Pistol Permit Class) is certified to apply for a New York State Pistol permit in many counties. The focus of this course is SAFETY. Subtopics covered include: Article 35 and NY laws pertaining to the use and carry of your Pistol, safe handling of a handgun in your home & on the range. This class is taught by Certified NRA Instructor, Cheryl Schenne. 3 hour course includes materials and a Certificate of Completion (required for Erie, Niagara, Orleans & Genesee County Pistol Permit application process).
